

VEHICLE OPERATIONS POLICY ON BACKING

- Agency ambulances must utilize a backer/spotter when available.
- Use a backing spotter every time and everywhere you back with the following exception:
 - If you need to back on a busy highway or interstate, use your lights and sirens and back with due regard. Do not get out of the ambulance in traffic to push the spotter button.
- Spotters must be placed on the driver's side rear of the unit as to ensure full vision of the spotter by the driver.
- The spotter must be in place prior to the unit being placed into reverse.
- Proper universal hand signals shall be used by the spotter to communicate to the driver.
- The unit must not exceed 1-2 mph while in reverse.

Look Ahead

- 1.Avoid backing.
- 2.Plan ahead.

Get the Broad View

1. Always use a spotter.

- 2. Use universal backing signals.
- 3. Roll down windows. Use extra lighting at night.
- 4.Spotter button must be pressed.
- 5. If you lose sight of your spotter, stop until sight is gained.
- 6. Utilize the GOAL method if necessary.

MEDIC DEFENSIVE DRIVING (MDD) - BACKING

Keep Scanning

- Pay attention to your spotter.
 Back up SLOWLY.
- 3.Don't be distracted.

Create a Safe Space

Back no further than you must.
 Use the curb as a indicator line.


Be Seen and Stand Out

1. Activate emergency lights.






BACK STRAIGHT

<u>MOVE RIGHT</u>






<u>MOVE LEFT</u>






DISTANCE FROM OBJECT

PREVENTABLE BACKING ACCIDENT - NEIGHBORHOOD








PREVENTABLE BACKING ACCIDENT - POST 50
