

Mecklenburg EMS Agency (Medic) Receives Bronze Recognition in the American Heart Association's Workplace Health Achievement Index Scientific Evidenced-Based Measure Rates, Recognizes Workplace Health Programs

[Charlotte, NC] November 23, 2016 – Mecklenburg EMS Agency (Medic) proudly received the 2016 bronze level recognition in the American Heart Association's inaugural results of the Workplace Health Achievement Index (Index), a science-based and evidence-informed measurement that assesses and recognizes workplace health programs. Initiated by the AHA's CEO Roundtable, the Index provides employers with best practices to evaluate the quality and effectiveness of workplace health programs.

"We are honored to have achieved the bronze recognition in workplace health from the American Heart Association," said Jeff Keith, Medic's, Deputy Director. "A key strategy at Medic is to build a supportive culture that engages employees and helps improve health outcomes.

The Workplace Health Achievement Index is unique in that it scores and recognizes companies both on the structure of the workplace health program and employee's heart health based on the AHA's seven behaviors and metrics for ideal heart health – Life's Simple 7®. Research shows that improving these seven factors can lead to significant reductions in heart disease, stroke, cancer and many other health problems. In addition, people who achieve ideal cardiovascular health by age 50 have significantly lower lifetime risk of heart disease and stroke, and live, on average, approximately 10 years longer than people with two or more risk factors.

"The stakes are high. We need to act now to improve the health of our American workforce. The Index offer employers a science-based approach to assess the quality of health programs and the overall heart health of their employees. The Index also offers a roadmap for continuous quality improvement regardless of where a company may be in that journey." said Gregory Grevelding, Medic's Public Relations Supervisor.

Comprehensively designed and fully implemented workplace health programs can help with job satisfaction and employee retention, as verified by a <u>Nielsen 2016 Employee Health Survey</u>. The Workplace Health Achievement Index gives companies a specific framework they can adopt to improve the quality and effectiveness of their programs, while learning from one another. The AHA CEO Roundtable companies serve as a learning laboratory environment to develop, test and refine the Workplace Health Achievement Index, as well as additional resources for practical use.
